Historical Resources report

Tom reported on several items regarding historic resources in town. He has now completed official Register nominations for the former Chung Mei Home site, the former Rodini property, and the former Contra Costa Florist building. He also noted that the revised plans submitted by Eden Housing several months ago for the Tradeway project retained the front (retail) portion of the former Contra Costa Florist building.

Tom also described the City Council's Strategic Plan study session on January 26th. The session started with a review of work done to date. The Council also heard a number of comments from the public. The remainder of the session was used by the Council to review various parts of the plan and then recommend certain actions be specifically implemented. Among these was the Council's agreement that the strategies used to implement the goals of the Strategic Plan should include:

i) El Cerrito will adopt a Historic Resources Ordinance, and

ii) El Cerrito will perform a survey of the town to identify the most likely historic resources.

Good of the Order

Barbara reported that she and Christine are considering a visit to the Richmond Museum of History to find out how some things are done behind the scenes.

Barbara also reported that the Society received an old small photo album that showed the construction of a home in the 1940's. She had exact photos in the History Room files but couldn't be identified but with the newly donated album she was able to tell the location of the photos.

David suggested and it was adopted that there be an item on every agenda updating preservation efforts.
