Minutes of Board Meeting February 18, 2021

- **1.) Minutes:** The minutes were approved as revised, with no comments or corrections.
- **2.)** Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Pat S. provided the Treasurer's report, dated February 18, 2021. She reported income of \$185 from dues and donations, and expenses of \$636.42. The Restricted Funds balance is \$5,500.00, the Unrestricted Funds balance is \$12,224.69. The Mechanics Bank Balance was \$17,724.69 as January 31, 2021. Pat also reported three new members.
- 3.) Board Member Comments not on Agenda: The San Pablo City Council has decided to sell the Alvarado Adobe. There has been no decision yet as to what will be done with their collection. It is hoped that any buyer of the Adobe will be encouraged to retain the historic look of the building.
- 4.) Public Comments: None
- **5.)** Events:
 - **a.** Pat Durham plans to present a virtual program on the history of the Martin Luther King Jr. Day Parade in El Cerrito, in May.
 - **b.** We need a topic and a presenter for a presentation in March or April.
- 6. **By-law revisions:** We need the by-laws to provide more clarity on process. Tom will look over the existing by-laws and will draft new language for election-related procedures, as well as others. There was a question about how many Board members we can have. Tom will check and report back next meeting, but it is thought 9 is the limit.
- 7. <u>Historic Map of El Cerrito:</u> In discussing plans for the map, Dave said that the Trail Trekkers map lists 60 places. We are planning to use the same size and style as that map. **Dave asked everyone to think of ideas for places to be listed. He agreed to circulate his list of ideas, so people can review and nominate additional places.**
- 8. Photos for exhibit at Creedence apt. building: Tom reminded everyone that it's important we adhere to any limits on copyright permissions for any photographs we may provide. Dave said he will connect the Creedence people to photo sources directly. This exhibit on the history of music in El Cerrito will consist of about 20 photos. This effort has inspired the idea of presenting our own exhibit on this subject, possibly in 2022. David Washburn has done a paper on country music in El Cerrito. Also, Nat King Cole played at the Kona Club in 1948. (or was it 1938?)

- **b.** Several old buildings that were behind Connors Garage Door have been razed. They were lacking historical integrity. There was a discussion of all the new development along San Pablo Ave., and the possibility of losing the city's history.
